The successful applicant is expected to contribute to a research project on 'Intergroup Contact and the Influence of Political Positions on Attitudes towards Immigration and Political Parties' under the supervision of Prof. Juan M. Falomir-Pichastor (University of Geneva) and Prof. Eva Green (University of Lausanne).

Requirements:

- Master degree in psychology.
- Excellent knowledge of social psychology literature on intergroup relations.
- Excellent knowledge of quantitative, statistical and experimental methods.
- Fluent in English (written and oral); knowledge of French is an important asset.
- Interest in interdisciplinary collaborations with other nccr – on the move collaborators in the framework of different NCCR events.
- Participation in the doctoral program in social psychology coordinated by the universities of Geneva and the University of Lausanne.
- Participation in an interdisciplinary doctoral program coordinated by the University of Neuchâtel.
- Regular attendance of events at the University of Neuchâtel, or elsewhere in Switzerland.
